PHC Madhubanighat and opening new HSC for Bardaha. We are getting positive response from Govt. health officials, Rogi Kalyan Samiti, Ad. PHC Madhubanighat and PRI Members.

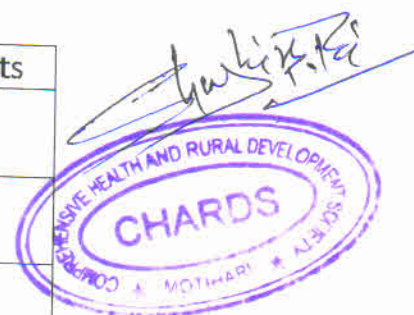



❖ Haemoglobin test of adolescent girls

It was organised in two phase in this financial year

First phase- 28th to 30th May 2022 at Project area and 159 girls were benefited through the health Camp of haemoglobin test.

After the testing of Haemoglobin we found the result.

- Normal (12-15 gm)-18 girls
- Mild (10-12 gm) 78 girls
- Moderate (08-10 gm) 39 girls
- Severe (below -8 gm) 24 girls

Second phase- 17th -19th November 22 at project area and 159 girls were benefited through the health Camp of haemoglobin test.

→ After the testing of Haemoglobin we found the result.

- Normal (Above 12g/dl) 35 girls
- Mild (11-11.9 g/dl) 34 girls
- Moderate (08-10.9 g/dl) 71 girls
- Severe (below -8 gm) 03 girls



We & our team suggested to anaemic girls & their parents among healthy & happy life, proper & nutritious diet, how to manage the severe anaemia etc. Along with we covered the following topics

- Cause of anaemia its effect on your health
- Regular Hand washing before & after food
- Method of hand washing
- How to get facility from aanganbadi centre for adolescent girls.
- Nutrition food
- Superstitious / Conservative tradition preset in the society
- Regular use of sanitary pad

❖ Celebration of Annprashan d God Bharai Diwas in ICDS centre

It was organised on date 7th and 19th of every month at project area of ICDS centres

As per our plan the program started by draping pregnant women with red chunari and applying red tika on their forehead. For better health of the mother and fetus and to reduce the possible complications during delivery, the pregnant as well as the family members should pay attention to good nutrition. Better nutrition helps in the birth of a healthy child and also reduces maternal mortality among pregnant women.

The body needs more nutrients during pregnancy. During this, it is necessary to have protein, vitamins and carbohydrates in the diet along with the amount of fat. For this, monthly nutritious food is distributed to pregnant women in Anganwadi centers. Essential nutrients can be easily supplied by consuming green vegetables, orange fruits, pulses, dry fruits and milk.

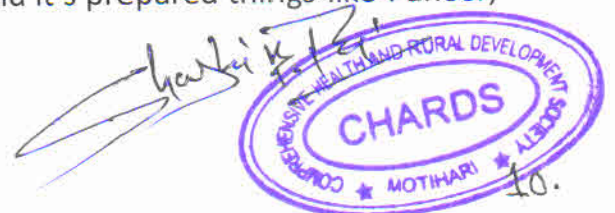

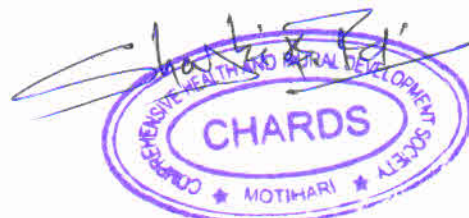

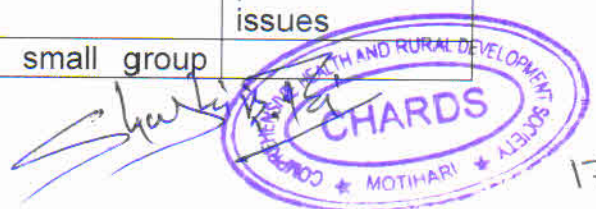
